

October meeting of the Austin Radio Control Association

Old business;

New business;

Cliff is investigating places to hold a swap meet next year. James Land, who helped with the Georgetown event, offered to give some input to whoever runs the swap meet. The Georgetown swap will be held on the 3rd weekend in January, probably at the old location. Jim Duda asked about next year's events. Edwin Smith said the war bird is slated for April 25-27. Ken is checking on the Jet Rally, because of several outside circumstances, could be either April 15 or early May. Cliff asked about a club Fun Fly and it seems that next year would be best. Jim Duda made a motion to install another pylon socket in the ground, 50 feet from the existing one (south, towards gun club) with the possibility of adding another class of racing. The motion passed 11 to 7. Ken made a motion that the club purchases some new heaters, up to \$250. This motion also carried.
